A Father's Change of Heart

How it Works

Student Identification

Students are identified by SSD educators based on their needs and interests. Students must have internet access and be capable of basic computer functions, with a strong foundation in verbal skills.

32 Sessions for 16 Weeks

Led by licensed professionals, iSocial brings together cohorts of 6 students with similar needs. Students engage in fun and interactive workshops, fostering communication and social development.

Proven Results

With support from 8 university studies, iSocial has demonstrated success in increasing communication skills, social motivation, and engagement. Participants experience measurable improvements in their ability to interact with others.
